## International webinar series organised by Mahama Gandhi Center for Conflict Resolution and Peace studies.

Mahama Gandhi Center for Conflict Resolution and Peace studies, of the Department of Philosophy, Lady Keane College, Shilllong organised along with North East India Institute of Social Sciences and Research (NEISSR), Dimapur, Nagaland, Peace Chanel of Nagaland, St.Xavier College, Jaluki, Nagaland an international webinar series on the theme

"Spirituality, Satyagraha and Pragmatism: New Dimensions in Gandhian Philosophy" in September, 2021. In its inaugural session on 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 at 9.30 a.m Shri.Remel Decruse, the then Principal in-charge, Lady Keane College, Shillong welcomed all the resource persons, dignitaries and participants formally to the webinar. In the keynote address Prof.Rakesh Chandra, Head, Department of Philosophy, Lucknow University, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, India exhibited in an elaborate way the relevance of Gandhian pragmatics in contemporary India. Civil and passive resistance, which has occurred in various forms throughout history, has become particularly prominent in the last few dacades infact the past one century itself. Three great overlapping causes decolonization, democratization, and racial equality—have been advanced by campaigns of civil resistance characterized by extensive use of nonviolent action. So have many other causes: workers' rights, protection of the environment, gender equality, religious and indigenous rights, defence of national cultures and political systems against foreign encroachments, and opposition to wars and weaponry. Civil resistance was one factor in the ending of communism and subsequently the long fought silent and Cold War. The world today shows a lot of interest towards this mode of non violent, practices both for its epistemological and pragmatical concerns.

## In the academic session that followed

Dr. Michael Myers, Professor Emeritus, Washington State University, Pullman, Washington USA, presented his paper entitled 'Gandhi, Jainism and Ahimsā' and Dr. Prasenjit Biswas, Associate Professor, North-Eastern Hill University, Shillong also presented his paper on the theme 'Gandhigiri as a way of Life: Swaraj of the mind'. Both the scholars pointed to the limits in the acceptance of opposing views and returns to the example of nonviolence in setting out these limits. Hate speech, for example, fails the criterion of nonharming. Ahimsā, therefore, is found useful as a principle of ethics both for formulating plans of constructive social action and for determining limits in our social dialogue.
