Report on Observation of international Human Rights Day-2021

The Lady Keane College Nodal Centre for Human Rights (LKCNCHR) is headed by the Principal of Lady Keane College Shillong, and has twelve (12) members as board of directors. This Nodal Centre was established in the year 2014, making the Department of Political Science the co-ordinating department.

The Lady Keane College Nodal Centre for Human Rights was established in accordance with the XI Plan Guidelines (2007-2012) of the University Grant Commission for Human Rights Education.

As an annual event, the nodal centre observes an International Human Rights Day on the 10th of December 2021. Professor Dr. K. Debbarma, Department of Political Science, North Eastern Hill University, was invited as the guest speaker of the event. The programme began with a welcome address from the Principal In-Charge of the college, Prof. R. Decruze.

The programme was held in the college auditorium from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The Guest Speaker expounded on the theme of the year, "Equality: Reducing Inequalities, Advancing Human Rights." The guest speaker enlightened the participants on the history, nature, and value of human rights. He also dwelt on the historical development of human rights and was able to engage the students on the theme. The speaker lamented the deplorable state when it comes to the realisation of human rights and equality for all individuals, especially during the pandemic.

Besides the members of the Nodal Centre, the programme was also attended by faculty from other departments and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college. However, keeping in view of the prevailing COVID-19 situation in the city, the nodal centre decided to restrict the total number of participants. There were 95 student participants in the observation of Human Rights Day-2021. The programme was successfully observed with the active support of IQAC of the college, and the programme ended with a vote of thanks from Mr. N. Mahongnao, the Coordinator of Lady Keane Nodal Centre for Human Rights.
